## 95<sup>th</sup> Poland Memorial Day Procession and Ceremonies planned

POLAND, OH – Sons of The American Legion Mahoning Valley Squadron 15 is happy to announce that the annual Memorial Day Procession and Ceremonies will be held over Memorial Day weekend, including additional events for 2024.

This year's events begin with Squadron 15's Sixth Annual



Sunday, May 27, 2024 | 2:00 p.m. | Squadron 15 Memorial Day Service The Inn at Poland Way 6501 Poland Way Poland, Ohio On Saturday, May 25, 2024, at historic Riverside Cemetery, a Flying Flags For Heroes (<a href="www.flyingflagsforheroes.com">www.flyingflagsforheroes.com</a>) ceremony will be held in conjunction with the annual Graves Decoration. Flying Flags For Heroes is a National Service Project implemented by Sons of The American Legion Past National Commander (2021 – 2022) Michael Fox (CA), with a goal of placing at least 1.5 million flags on the graves of veterans this year.

Squadron 15 will place over 1,500 flags, with the Detachment of Ohio committing to place 100,000 flags before the end of August. The public is invited to attend and participate in the decoration of graves. Anyone wishing to assist can meet at the first driveway behind the chapel no later than 8:55 a.m.

At 9:15 a.m. on Memorial Day, Monday, May 27, Sons of The American Legion will conduct its annual Four Chaplains ceremony, honoring four military chaplains who gave up their life jackets after their ship, the USS Dorchester was hit by a torpedo and sunk. This event will take place at the War Memorial Building Post 15 home, located at 35 Cortland Street in Poland.



Promptly at 10:00 a.m. the 95<sup>th</sup> Annual Memorial Day Procession will step off from the from Post 15, and will travel down College Street, turn right on South Main Street, where a ceremony for those Lost at Sea will take place on the Main Street Bridge.

The Procession will continue on South Main, turning left onto Riverside Drive and into historic Riverside Cemetery for full Memorial Day Ceremonies.

This year's Procession Grand Marshal is United States Air Force Reserve Veteran and Squadron 15 member Anthony

E. "Chip" Anderson. The Keynote Speaker will be American Legion Department of Ohio Adjutant John "JD" Robinson. Special Guests for 2024 are Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Ohio Commander Tim Conway, and American Legion Department of Ohio Oratorical Contest State Champion Katie Toepfer. The Chaplain of the Day will be announced in the coming days.

Sons of The American Legion Past National Vice-Commander Jeff Vrabel, Sr. said, "Memorial Day is about remembering our military heroes who made the ultimate and supreme sacrifice to defend our great country. It is a day to recognize them and remember them. Memorial Day is a 'Day of Remembrance.' As *proud possessors of a priceless heritage*, we will do just that, remember them," he said.

At 10:15 a.m. Squadron 15 is asking musicians, especially those who play trumpet, to go outside, and play *Taps* to honor and remember those lost in defense of our great country. "It's the least we can do," Vrabel said. 10:15 a.m. is the approximate time that the ceremony honoring those Lost at Sea will take place on the Main Street Bridge.

It is also especially important for people to fly the American flag, not only on Memorial Day, but every day.

The Four Chaplains - Lt. George L. Fox, Lt. Alexander D. Goode, Lt. John P. Washington, and Lt. Clark V. Poling - unselfishly gave their lifejackets to four others when their ship, the USTA Dorchester, sank after being torpedoed by a German submarine. The Four Chaplains were last seen linked arm in arm, when their ship sank into icy black waters.

### **Memorial Day Procession**

The Procession travels down College Street, right on South Main Street, left on Riverside Drive and into the Riverside Cemetery. A brief ceremony will also be held on the Main Street Bridge in honor of those lost at sea, with a full Memorial Services in Riverside Cemetery. American Legion Department of Ohio Adjutant John "JD" Robinson will serve as the Keynote Speaker. United States Air Force Reserve Veteran and Squadron 15 member Anthony E. "Chip" Anderson will serve as Procession Grand Marshal. Special Guests are Sons of The American Legion Detachment of Ohio Commander Tim Conway, and American Legion Department of Ohio Oratorical Contest Champion Katie Toepfer. The Chaplain of the Day will be announced in the coming days.

Please keep in mind that no commercial and/or political units will be permitted to participate. The throwing of candy during the procession and the distribution of any items along the procession route is also prohibited. This is done as a way of saying we are here today to honor our military dead, and for no other reason. Those doing so will be denied participation or asked to leave by Procession Marshals. This Sons of The American Legion Mahoning Valley Squadron 15 policy will be strictly enforced.

# Historic Poland Riverside Cemetery Graves Decoration to take place May 25, 2024



POLAND, OH – Graves Decoration at Historic Poland Riverside Cemetery will take place on Saturday, May 25, 2024 at 9:00 a.m. Members of American Legion Mahoning Valley Post 15, American Legion Auxiliary Mahoning Valley Unit 15, and Sons of The American Legion Mahoning Valley Squadron 15 will be joined by local Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, and youth leadership groups to place over 1,500 flags on the graves of United States Military Veterans.

"It is a great thing to have the Scouts and leadership groups assist in the graves decoration," said Squadron 15 Commander and Past National Vice-Commander Jeff Vrabel, Sr. "They do a great job. It makes it easier for the veterans who participate because the Scouts get done so quickly. The veterans usually place flags at the start but do more follow-up to make sure no one was missed. The kids really get a lot out of participating and helps promote patriotism and Americanism." Should a grave be inadvertently missed, flags will be available from Chris Nord at the Cemetery Office.

Family members are asked to have their flag holders in place for the May 25, 2024 Graves Decoration, which will take place rain or shine.

Anyone interested in participating in Graves Decoration at Riverside Cemetery should come to the cemetery by 8:55 a.m. and meet at the first driveway behind the Chapel.
