July 8, 2026**

The Poland Township Board of Trustees held a regular meeting July 8, 2026 at the Poland Township Government Center located at 3339 Dobbins Road Poland, Ohio.

Mr. Ungaro calls the meeting to order.

Officer Jackson leads the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Covell does roll call. Ungaro, Kempers, and DeMain are present.

The media was properly notified.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Ralph Schultheis 3079 Chardonnay Lane, expresses concerns regarding garbage pickup times.

Greg Riddle 7825 Lee Run Road, expresses his thoughts that Poland Township should build their own sanitary system.

Resident gives thanks to Mr. Ungaro for having poles removed.

Mr. Ungaro moves to authorize payments for all outstanding bills for the township. Seconded by Mr. DeMain. Voting yes – Ungaro, DeMain and Kempers. Motion carried.

Mr. Ungaro moves to approve Resolution 26-18: An addendum to resolution no. 19-14 establishing rules and regulations for mobile food vehicles within Poland Township. Seconded by Mr. DeMain. Voting yes – Ungaro, DeMain and Kempers. Motion carried.

Mr. Ungaro moves to approve Resolution 26-19: A resolution authorizing the Poland Township trustees to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder for the 2026 Cowden and Hamilton resurfacing and safety upgrade project. Seconded by Mr. DeMain. Voting yes – Ungaro, DeMain and Kempers. Motion carried.

Mr. Ungaro moves to approve Resolution 26-21 A resolution authorizing the Poland Township trustees to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Mahoning County Commissioners and the Mahoning

County Engineer regarding the application of funds from the additional non-emergency sales and use tax for the repair and maintenance of roads and other infrastructure in Poland Township. Seconded by Mr. DeMain. Voting yes – Ungaro, DeMain and Kempers. Motion carried.

Board discusses the new streetlight at Dobbins elementary School crosswalk and also held a small discussion of the Greenback Energy Grant.

Mr. Ungaro moves to approve the contract with Boak & Sons for the insulation not to exceed \$9,000. Seconded by Mr. DeMain. Voting yes – Ungaro, DeMain and Kempers. Motion carried.
